A School-Parent Compact is an agreement that families, students, and teachers develop together. It explains how families and teachers will work together to make sure all students reach grade level standards.

### Effective Compacts:

- Link goals to the School Improvement Plan
- Focus on student learning skills
- Describe how teachers will help students develop skills using high-quality instruction
- Share strategies families can use at home
- Explain how teachers and families will communicate progress

## Jointly Developed

The families and staff of E. A. Harrold Elementary developed the School-Parent Compact. Teachers suggested home learning strategies, while families added ideas to make them more specific. Meetings and events are held each year to review the compact and make changes based on student and family needs.

	<div data-bbox="1257 1060 1438 1101"><b>Students</b></div> <ul data-bbox="779 1146 1927 1406" style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Talk with your family about new vocabulary words and what you are learning.</li><li>• Play games at home to practice new vocabulary words and math.</li><li>• Try to make up your own learning game and share it with the class.</li><li>• Read for at least 20 minutes each night.</li><li>• Bring home your class newsletter and invitations.</li><li>• Log in to virtual platforms, submit requested assignments, and log in to Teams meetings.</li></ul>
